Summary	<p>The session was organized with an aim to familiarize the students with the concept of Governance, and to make them aware how a country can have maximum governance with minimum government.</p> <p>The resource person started the session by explaining the difference between Government and Governance. Prof. Mittal also mentioned that “In order to maintain the maximum governance with minimum government a country requires effective and transparent policies in the organizations”.
