Web Report on Industrial Visit to "Gopaljee Dairy"

Title	Industrial Visit to "Gopaljee Dairy" for the students of BBA II Semester

Summary	An industry visit for BBA-II semester students was organized by RDIAS,
	to align them with real industrial practices and processes. Therefore,
	students were taken for a visit to, Faridabad to provide them with the
	insight of manufacturing and processing of dairy products. Gopaljee Dairy
	has been operating from past 35 years under the supervision of Mr.
	Gopaljee, Managing Director of Dairy.
	Dairy has two Plants in Faridabad. Mr. S.K. Shukla along with his
	assistant showed around the students and informed them about working of
	plants in a group of two. The students were introduced to labeling units,
	skimmed milk, Milk powder manufacturing units, tetra packing units as
	well as the concentrated juice units. During the visit students were asked
	to wear caps and masks to ensure the hygiene standards. It was surprising
	to know the fact that patanjali and mother dairy used the packing services
	of Gopaljee. Thereafter, students were given free samples to taste their
	organic produce such as Flavored Milk and packed juices.
	Students asked various questions related to the working and establishment
	of Gopaljee dairy. The cleanliness in the plant was remarkable; the
	resource person appreciated the queries put forward by the students.
	For students pursuing professional education, industrial visits help them
	gain hands-on experience of how industry operations are executed.
	Industry visits bridge the gap between theoretical training and practical
	learning in a real-life environment. It broadens the outlook of students
	with exposure to different workforces from different industries.
